Service user involvement Project with Children 1st and ParentLine

We are delighted to have been successful in gaining funding from Edinburgh and Lothian Health Foundation for £15000 on behalf of NHS Lothian. This money will support Children 1st through the use of ParentLine to gain feedback from parents and carers of children and young people who have undergone a medical examination. We look forward to working with Children 1st and ParentLine over the next year.

ParentLine Scotland is the free, confidential helpline, email and webchat service for anyone caring for, or concerned about a child. Our training is recognised by COSCA, the counselling and psychotherapy body, based in Scotland. ParentLine volunteer call-takers commit to over 40 hours of training and are supervised on each shift by a paid member of staff.

We take calls from the public about a wide range of issues, where we offer support, information and advice, and where appropriate, signpost to other agencies. In addition to this we have, over the years, successfully carried out a number of telephone surveys and recently telephone evaluations.

We are delighted to be working in partnership with NHS Lothian to harness the views of families, to provide a better service in future.

Clinical Lead Update

One of the highlights for the MCN this year was the 'Witness Familiarisation' Court Skills course conducted by Betty Bott on the 9th November. Betty is a lawyer with a wealth of experience in child protection as a member of the Crown Office and Procurator Fiscal Service. Candidates had both theoretical and role play scenario training. The course was evaluated very highly. We are considering further courses in 2015.

Over 2014 we have collaborated with the West of Scotland and North of Scotland Child Protection MCNs to look at common issues and solutions. We have reached the stage in our MCN when we are ready to explore whether we should broaden our remit beyond Child Sexual Abuse. In 2015, we intend to arrange meetings with key stakeholders to discuss the potential benefits of this move.

Child Sexual Exploitation

Barnardo's have made major progress, working with the Scottish Government and local child protection agencies to improve the way CSE is tackled in Scotland. Child Sexual Exploitation training

The 3 Child Protection MCNs in Scotland have organised "Just Whistle" to deliver a one day training course on Child Sexual Exploitation. The course can take 25 participants and is open to clinicians working in child protection. There are 2 one day courses being held - 18 March 2015 and 25 March 2015 venue and costs TBC. The course will cover:

Full day CSE training

- What is CSE?
- Psychology of victims vulnerabilities, impact of CSE, indicators of CSE, cycle of abuse
- Psychology of perpetrators grooming, CSE models, methodology, characteristics, model of abuse
- CSE and consent
- CSE and the Law
- Engaging young people affected/at risk of CSE
- Myth busting, stereotyping and misconceptions
- Sharing and recording information
- Resources and tools

MCN Education & Training Sub Group

The MCN Education & Training Subgroup has now implemented the training and education strategy.

Following a further training needs analysis in 2014 the main requests for further training are:

- Colposcopy update
- · Court skills and Report Writing
- Forensic sampling
- Sexual Health/HepB and PEP timing including case discussions
- · Genital wart guidance
- Staying well emotional &psychological health at work
- Paediatric gynaecology clinical conditions and abnormalities

Most of these topics will be covered at Peer review sessions and on separate training days.

Good news is that our first teaching DVD has been created and is available on the MCN website. This is on STI screening and we plan to record another DVD on forensic sampling in the New Year. Requests for other teaching DVDs are welcome.
